PROGRAM OVERVIEW

- Started in response to rising anti-Asian sentiment during COVID-19
- Takes confidential and anonymous reports of hate/bias incidents
- Provides outreach, support and referrals to targets, and education
- Is trauma-informed and does not involve the police
- CISC is part of the King County Coalition Against Hate and Bias, a community-led initiative to address racism, hate, bias, and oppression
- Since July 2020, CISC has collected **over 200 reports** in King County in **six languages**: Cantonese, Mandarin, Vietnamese, Russian, Spanish, and English

TRENDS: INCIDENT DETAILS & TARGET IDENTITY

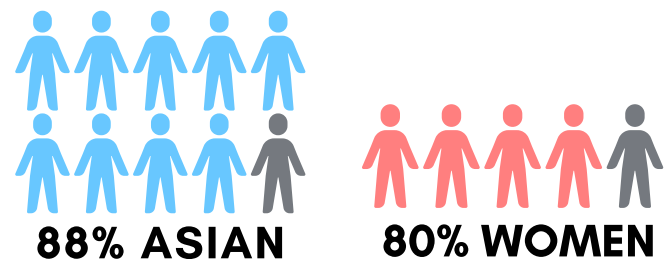
MOST COMMON INCIDENTS

Verbal assault/threats	35%
Physical threats/assaults	17%
Different/unfair treatment	15%
Robbery, burglary, theft	9%

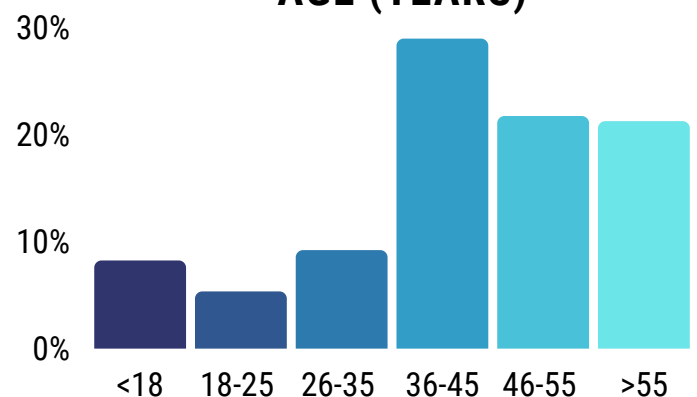
MOST COMMON LOCATIONS
